Student and ex-student's Achievements



Dr Alice James, who graduated this summer (2017) published data she collected as part of her Year 4 SSC project in the British Medical Journal Open. For her SSC, Alice examined the food and drink offerings of NHS venues, and compared these to NICE Quality Standard 94 (QS94) guidance on childhood obesity. Alice found that hospitals were inconsistent in their compliance with QS94 and with the support of colleagues based in the NIHR Bristol Biomedical Research Centre (Nutrition Theme), this paper was published in November 2017. The Intercalation Fair was in the Great Hall this year and was as busy as ever. All the Bristol courses on


offer to Medics, Dentists and Vets were represented
