## Funding

Funding offered will cover clinical salary, PhD fees and associated project consumables. A budget will also be available for training and travel costs for the duration of the PhD.

## Eligibility

This opportunity is aimed at exceptionally motivated clinically qualified trainees who are at an early stage of their career, but who can demonstrate the capability and drive to undertake a period of research with a view to developing a long-term career as a clinical academic.

Project proposals are not expected at the application stage. Competitive recruitment will be undertaken through submission of the following documents by the closing date:

- A personal statement (2 pages maximum, 10 point Arial). This should outline your achievements to date, any research experience including publications and awards, your future career ambitions, and why you want to apply to this programme.

Academic references will only be requested if the applicant is shortlisted.
